

Honoring Beatrix Potter's 150th Birthday,
Multi-Generational Service with Rev. Jennie Barrington

During the month of July, Rev. Jennie has been taking vacation time. She will be back in the office on Tuesday, August 2nd. She has also been preparing and researching for sermons and worship services in the upcoming year. Please plan now to join us for worship services in August, which will be warm and enriching. The service on August 7th, presented by Rev. Jennie and Stephanie Palmer-Smith and the CYRE Team, will be a celebration of Beatrix Potter, who would be 150 years old this year. It will be multigenerational, and appealing to all ages. Beatrix Potter was a famous Unitarian who wrote and illustrated the beloved children's books including "Peter Rabbit." She was also an environmentalist and conservationist far ahead of her time. The worship service on August 14th will feature nationally-known guest speaker, Roger Ray, whose scholarship and theology are similar to Bishop Shelby Spong. And Sunday August 21st will be our "Ingathering Sunday," featuring our UU Water Communion ritual. Please remember to bring some water from a special place, or begin to think of a special place that, symbolically, the water you contribute represents and honors. Many, many ducks (and also new sunflowers!) are lining up brightly in rows for the upcoming church year to be filled with enrichment, new learning, camaraderie, joy, and happy successes for the whole congregation. President's Column

As I begin a year as president of the board of a UU congregation, I should share my feelings about this role. I am humbled, excited, fearful, and hopeful. Even though I have been a UU president and chief executive officer of two colleges, I am aware of the special nature of the year that faces the UUCC. We are, indeed, as a congregation, at the proverbial fork in the road. In the past year, we have lost our long-time minister, suffered a significant decline in membership, and experienced a budgetary shortfall that has resulted in the depletion of reserves. We find it difficult to populate committees to continue basic services. One fork in the road would have us withdraw into ourselves, continue with bathrooms that are an embarrassment, ceilings that make one glad that most of us don't pray looking up, a declining financial picture, a poor web presence, and other attributes that would make it difficult to attract the dynamic minister that we need.

The other fork entails bold actions, with a risk of failure, that can result in a renovated interior, attractive outside grounds and building exterior, fully staffed committees, vibrant RE programs, growing membership, continued impact on social issues, a secure financial situation, and a minister who will provide the leadership we need for years to come.

We will make this choice in the near future and, despite Yogi Berra's advice, we can't take both forks. We have a congregation that is accomplishing amazing things. I am confident that we will choose the path of bold actions, despite the risk of failure. Ultimately, not taking this path comes with an even greater risk. Our past co-presidents used the phrase "We are the UUCC" to remind us that it is the membership of the congregation that ultimately determines what we are and will be. I would like to challenge each of us to reflect on what this phrase means to you.



The Ministerial Search Committee met for the first time with our Settlement Representative Ann Marie Alderman. David Crockett is our Chair.



UUCC Board of Trustees

Summary of May 11, 2016 Meeting

The Board of Trustees held a special called meeting May 11. The meeting was initially scheduled for the sole purpose of discussing the Budget for FY 2016-17. Later the cost of the mold removal was added to the agenda.

First Reading of the 2016-17 UUCC Budget

The Finance Committee presented their budget proposal. Pledges are lower than desired. As recommended by the UUA, \$9,500 was set aside to cover the costs of the ministerial search process. There will be no salary increases for staff. We will discontinue our newspaper ad. Our annual payment to the UUA was decreased from 7% to 3% of our annual revenue. The budget proposal was approved by the Board.

Update on Mold Clean Up

The two companies are ready to work on mold removal and duct cleaning in the RE wing. There is a discrepancy in the contracts about how much the work will cost. Earlier we had been told the cost for mold treatment would be \$3,800. Now we are being told the cost will be \$8,400; the 10-year warranty was not included in the earlier analysis. Marc will get accurate costs and contact members for an e-mail vote to approve/disapprove so the work may proceed.

Summary of May 18, 2016 Meeting

The Board of Trustees met from 6:30 PM until 8:43 PM.

Policy on Share the Plate Collections

Linda McLeod presented the policy developed by the Social Action Committee. The Board will take a final vote on it at the June meeting.

Conference on Progressive Religion

Richard McLeod and Rebecca Drennan talked about the Worship Committee's plans for this conference to be held at UUCC August 12-14, 2016. They plan for the conference to be self-supporting but not a money-maker. Tickets will be sold for \$20; they hope to sell 200. They have requested a loan of \$1,000 from the UUCC for start-up money to purchase publicity, refreshments, etc. Roger Ray, the keynote speaker, is willing to absorb the cost if we do not sell enough tickets. The Board approved the loan.

Treasurer's Report

Pledge income dropped sharply in April. We currently have a pledge shortfall of \$10,695 for this fiscal year.

Committee Reports

Building & Grounds The mold treatment is done and paid for. The Trustees re-affirmed their e-mail vote to pay \$6389 for mold removal (includes 10-year warranty) and \$1600 for duct cleaning in the RE wing. Linda Brennon filed a claim with our insurance company; our policy has some coverage for mold treatment. A representative from the company is scheduled to visit the building tomorrow.

Denominational Connections Carolyn West, John Logue, and Bob and Keitha Whitaker will serve as UUCC Delegates to UUA General Assembly. We will pay \$200 per person toward their registration cost if they desire.

Leadership Development Committee Patrick Saucier resigned from the Board of Trustees and withdrew his consent to serve for the next two years. The Committee met and selected possible candidates to take his place; all of them refused. The Committee recommends that the Board operate with one less member for the coming fiscal year.

UUCC Website Update We have no plan or process for maintenance of the website. We need a group with a very clear mandate, including responsibilities assigned to them by the board. Some of that group could be recruited from the ad hoc Committee on Implementation of the New Website.

Ad Hoc Committee on Organization Governance Regina has requested an ad hoc committee to address organizational governance and structure. The Board agreed to have the Co-Presidents name a committee to review, analyze, and revise our UUCC governance and structure.

Finance Committee The Board approved the latest version of the budget for fiscal year 2016-17 of \$209,000 with a shortfall of \$71.94.
