

Minister's Meditation

The Rev. Jennie Barrington, Interim Minister

"You can taste love in food."

Dear Members and Friends,

I don't know the origin of the above quote. But it brings to mind for me that loving one another, and feeding others and ourselves, are not separate undertakings; they are intertwined. The above quote came to mind for me as I reflected on the wonderfully gracious evening we had at our church on Friday evening, June 2nd, with so many members, friends, and neighbors, in honor of Ramadan. In collaboration with The Atlantic Institute, and its Director, Dr. Akif Aydin, we learned new things about Ramadan and Islam, increased our awareness of interfaith issues both locally and nation-wide, began many new friendships, and then broke bread together. The feast, which was spread the length of the Social Hall, was truly the result of gifts of love. I am grateful to everyone who helped make the evening so caring and enjoyable. The original thought behind “You can taste love in food” may be from religious author Kahlil Gibran who wrote, “Work is love made visible.” In his essay, “On Work,” in his book, *The Prophet*, Gibran reflects on work as laboring with our hands, and as sowing seeds, and as singing. He writes of how engaging in a common endeavor binds a group together in lasting ways, perhaps even everlasting ways. This week you have the opportunity to do all that, and more. A milestone week in the congregation is upon us: your Candidating Week, with Candidate Minister the Rev. Jeff Liebmann. As you read this, you already have a taste of what that week is like. I hope you are having a great time! Rev. Jeff preached on June 11th, and will preach again on June 18th, followed by an all-member vote to call him as new settled minister of UUCC. Friends of UUCC can attend that meeting, but only members may vote. This week, there are ample opportunities for Rev. Jeff to meet with members, their families, staff, and friends of UUCC. These gatherings are sometimes called, “Meet and Greet and Eat.” They are opportunities for you to “show up and step up,” and to feed Rev. Jeff abundantly. In short, you will have opportunities to do what you do best, and be who you are as your best selves. These several gatherings will also be your chance to ask all your questions and raise any concerns you have. Candidating Week is when you should talk directly with Rev. Jeff, the Search Committee, and the Board about UUCC’s history; present successes, joys, and concerns; and bright future. Following the worship service on June 18th, Rev. Jeff will leave the building, and a congregational meeting will be convened, that members must formally sign in for. It is best practices not to have a discussion before the vote-to-call. So all questions and concerns should be expressed previously. I know you will do beautifully with all the work, social times, and discussions this week. As a heads-up, I will not be at the church. It is necessary that I absent myself so that all of you and Rev. Jeff can get to know each other without my influencing nor interfering in any way. I look forward to hearing the result of the vote, and I imagine it will be a happy success!

So please make every effort to attend the several gatherings and meetings of Candidating Week, and especially the worship service on June 18th. And, if you are a member, please make every effort to attend the congregational meeting and vote-to-call. A high turn-out for that vote will shine an enthusiastic light on the culmination of UUCC’s search process, and on its future.

In Kahlil Gibran’s essay, “On Work,” he writes:

“And what is it to work with love? ...It is to build a house with affection, even as if your beloved were to dwell in that house. It is to sow seeds with tenderness and reap the harvest with joy, even as if your beloved were to eat the fruit. It is to charge all things you fashion with a breath of your own spirit, and to know that all the blessed dead are standing about you and watching.”

During your Candidating Week, may you reap the harvest of all the good work you have done during this interim period, and infuse your congregation with affection, so that your congregation’s dearly departed predecessors may look upon you with pride and love.

Ministerial Search Committee Update

The ministerial search committee is proud to introduce the candidate for the settled minister position, Reverend Jeffrey Liebmann, most recently of the Midland (MI) congregation. He comes to us with over six years experience as a Unitarian Universalist minister and has received final fellowship from the UUA. As you will note in his brief biography, he has a real passion for social justice and Religious Education.

Biography

Rev. Jeff graduated from Meadville Lombard Theological School and entered Unitarian Universalist ministerial fellowship in 2010 after a career in planning and budgeting at the University of Pittsburgh. After student ministries in Pennsylvania and New York, he was called to serve as the minister of the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Midland (Michigan) for the past six years.

During his first year in Midland, the state of Michigan went politically “red” and the Occupy Wall Street movement erupted. He jumped into both, helping organize vigils and rallies, as well as testifying before numerous State legislative committees, and local city and county commissions. He has written hundreds of online and print editorials on reproductive justice, LGBTQIA rights and equality, racism, sexism, gun control, church/state relations, among many other topics.

Initially raised in the Disciples of Christ tradition (United Church of Christ), Rev. Jeff explored many religions as a teen, eventually discovering Unitarian Universalism at the age of 30. As a mystical omnitheist, he believes that god is all existence in every plane and universe, and that we all can connect with the Spirit of Love through intuition and mystical experience. He preaches the wisdom of each religion, while encouraging listeners to challenge paradigms and blaze their own spiritual paths. He counts among his spiritual heroes Theodore Parker and Kenneth Patton, James Reeb and Viola Liuzzo, Gandhi and Martin Luther King, Jr., and all the great heretics of history.

He met his wife Jody in Midland, both bringing two adult children into the marriage. Together, Jody and Jeff traveled to Lansing, Washington D.C., and Raleigh for social justice events. Jody provides enormous support for Jeff’s ministry, and he supports her career as a social worker. Jeff collects books and vinyl records and Jody works with watercolor and acrylics. Both avidly attend garage and estate sales looking for undiscovered treasures. They share their home with Oliver the Dachshund, and cat brothers, Holmes and Watson.

All the Liebmanns are excited to come to the Palmetto State and do the work of creating the Beloved Community in Columbia.

Policy from the Worship Committee about Sunday morning Announcements

Attention committee chairs:

The Worship Committee has again been discussing guidelines for allowing the making of announcements during the Sunday service. The need to be limited is essential to contain the length of the service and to allow the expedient dismissal of the children to their classes. Any announcements your committee has should be included in the Order of Service, the Unigram, website, Facebook, and/or on posters/flyers in the building. Announcements made from the pulpit are discouraged and forgetting to place it in established media is not an excuse for a last-minute rush. If you believe a pulpit announcement must be made for a particular reason, make a request to the Board member of the day by placing the announcement in the notebook outside the Administrator's office, to be picked up before the service. It must be written in advance and be very brief. Generally the announcement will be made by the board member and not by the individual submitting the announcements. Rare exceptions will be at the discretion of the board member. The Worship Committee thanks you for helping us to make our worship services run more smoothly and on schedule.”

Treasurer's Report

Bob Whitaker reported that we are in good shape financially with pledges just under expectation while non-pledge giving, plate collections and fund-raising are over the expected figures. Capital Campaign payments are at \$110,709.
