I am writing to update you all on several recent actions taken by your Board of Trustees.



The movie is titled, "What the Health" and attempts to uncover the secret of preventing and even reversing chronic diseases. From the film maker's point of view, many of the nation's leading health organizations (such as the American Heart Association, the American Cancer So-

ciety, to name a few) don't want people to know about this discovery, and his goal in the film is to investigate the reasons why. *For anyone suffering from a chronic illness such as high cholesterol, diabetes, or high blood pressure, this film is a must-see!!*

It wouldn't be "a night at the movies" without snacks, of course, so the Animal Ministry will be serving plant-based finger food prior to the film and during intermission. There will be an optional discussion following "What the Health," and those who are interested are encouraged to stay.
