

## We Can Soar Together --Our Budget is Our Balloon

Our UUCC pledge drive traditionally starts in March -- this year the kickoff is after the service on Sunday, March 8. Pick up your pledge card and join the congregation for food, fun, and festivities.

What is our goal for this year? \$235,000. This amount is based upon historical data on income and expenses, with some modifications for anticipated changes and new initiatives.

Where does our money come from? Almost all of our income is from member contributions. Having these in the form of yearly pledges makes budgeting and planning for the year much easier. We do have some rental and other income.

How does our money get spent? Most of our money is spent on fixed costs, such as salaries, insurance, services, and utilities. As is the case in most households, only a limited amount is available for discretionary expenses.

Who decides what's in the budget? You do. For a large group this process takes some coordination, so your representatives handle the initial stages. The Finance Committee reviews income and expenses for the previous year and solicits anticipated expenses from committees, staff, and the Board. Based upon this input, the committee prepares a draft budget, which is presented to the Board. After Board approval, the budget will be posted for review by members. It will then be formally presented to the membership for approval at the annual meeting. A budget meeting is held shortly before the annual meeting to allow those interested sufficient time to discuss the details.

When are these meetings? The budget meeting will be held on Friday, May 29, at 7 pm; the annual meeting is scheduled for Sunday, May 31, after the service.

Who is on the Finance Committee? Caroline Eastman is the current chair. Members include Joe Long, and Carolyn West. All committee members are approved by the Board, which is not the case for most committees. Our Treasurer, Jeannette Walton, and our President, Linda Brennison, are ex officio members. Our Bookkeeper, Ginny Verne, provides essential support to the committee.

How much should I pledge? This is your decision. UUA has guidelines in the form of The Suggested Fair-Share Contribution Guide; copies will be available at the kickoff meeting. We are asking that you consider increasing your pledge by 10% this year so that we can meet our goal for the year.

What is the pledge year? This is the same as UUCC's fiscal year – July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021. Contributions made during a fiscal year will be assumed to be for that fiscal year unless you specify otherwise.

How can I pay my pledge? Choose a method of payment convenient for you. This may be weekly or monthly contributions during the service. It may be a single lump sum, especially if you are making a qualified charitable contribution from a retirement account. *NOTE: The eligibility age is changing from 70 1/2 to 72 in 2020. You MUST check with your tax advisor on your eligibility.* 

Can I designate how my pledge can be used? Pledges are for the general fund, which allows the most flexibility in budgeting and planning. In some cases designated gifts may be made in addition to your pledge. Recent examples include the Boston trip matching challenge fund and the new hearing assist aids. Fundraising and similar supplemental gifts should be coordinated with the Finance Committee and the Board.

Can I contribute items to UUCC? If you have items you're ready to part with, we may be able to use them. Check with the appropriate committee to see if we can use a specific item. DO NOT bring items and simply drop them off. They may not fit into our plans and our space, however well intentioned. We may have another yard sale this year. If so, we'll let you know.

What is the theme for this year? Soar with Us! Hop on and explore. Let us know where you want to go. Spreadsheets, pledge cards, budgets, and checks can get impersonal and, quite frankly, dull. What's important is what we do with the money. What is your dream for UUCC? Whatever it is, it almost certainly requires some money. Your pledge can help our dreams come true.

#### **UUCC Security Update**

In January security cameras were installed and inefficient and inadequate outside lighting was replaced with bright light but low energy motion sensitive lights. They now completely surrounding the building. Additionally, Dominion Energy has upgraded the two large street type lamps. One is between the Memorial Garden and the side entrance and the other is in the playground area. This will also lower our monthly bill for this lighting.

There are now motion lights for the Memorial Garden that will provide lighting but will not be intrusive for anyone wanting to visit the garden at night. Part of the upgrade was to rewire some suspect and possibly dangerous wiring from past projects, and replacing some faulty wiring.

Inside there are two cameras, one in the sanctuary and one in the social hall. Three cameras are strategically located on the exterior, including the main entrance. There was already a Ring camera on the side entrance. The cameras are motion sensitive and will record to a monitor inside the building, and to appropriate exterior devices. The videos will be stored for three months on a hard drive and then new pictures will replace the old automatically.

Upon recommendation from the Police Department 24 hours camera surveillance signs will be placed in appropriate locations on the property, and also on windows and doors to act as a deterrent. It is now up to us to be sure that we do our part by locking doors when we are one of the last ones leaving the building. The side doors in the Social Hall are a particular problem. That is being addressed as one of the next security measures.

# February 29, 7am-7pm: SC Presidential Primary

#### How 135 Iowans ended up caucusing in a Florida congregation

What happens when the opportunity to host a group of Iowans wanting to participate in their state's caucus from 1,500 miles away presents itself? That's exactly what the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Charlotte County, Florida, faced when a local Iowan inquired about renting space for one of two dozen out-of-state satellite Democratic Caucus locations. At first, the congregation's board worried about the ramifications of renting space to a political party.

Like any good UU congregation, UUFCC members talked about it, sent it to committee, had the board of directors debate it, and eventually a majority agreed that the request from the Iowa Democratic Party met all the requirements for renting space to an outside group. The caucus group paid the congregation's standard rental rate and they were held accountable for their own set up and clean up afterward. For UUFCC minister, Rev. Dr. Dan Lambert, it was about much more than simply encouraging the democratic process by providing a way for Iowans in Florida to participate in their home state's caucus for the first time in history.

"What everyone anticipated would be a small group of maybe two dozen local Democrats, turned into a large, energetic group of 135 registered Iowa voters on vacation in Florida assembled in our sanctuary on Caucus Day," noted Lambert. "It's impossible to measure the impact of having UUFCC's name and location reported on by more than a dozen different media outlets covering the event."




#### Walk A Mile, Thursday, April 23
