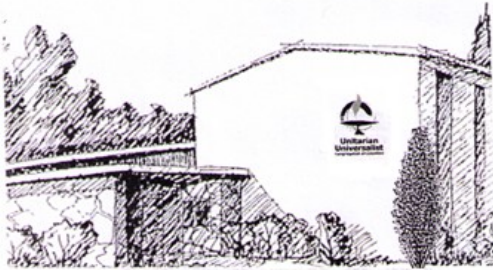

The Creek Keeps Running Rev. Stephen Robinson

For the past six to eight weeks, life as we know it has slowed down or stopped entirely. School halls echo from the lack of the noises of learning and socializing. Restaurant tables and chairs sit isolated and empty like children sentenced to time out. Buildings that once held the vibrant energy of faith communities look more like ancient, deserted temples in the desert. Busy energy buzzes around hospitals and grocery stores, helping us survive this scary crisis. Calendars have surrendered in defeat, giving way to postponements or cancellations of graduations, proms, sporting events, weddings, funerals, and travel plans. While this virus has brought our lives to a screeching halt, the earth keeps spinning, and the movement of nature continues its rhythm.

I'm reminded of words from Annie Dillard, in her book, *Pilgrim at Tinker Creek*, as she notes, “It has always been a happy thought to me that the creek runs on all night, new every minute, whether I wish it or know it or care, as a closed book on a shelf continues to whisper to itself its own inexhaustible tale.” Despite the screeching halt, life is still happening, births and deaths, and the multitude of transitions between.

May provides a chance for us to acknowledge and celebrate the moving creek at the UUCC. On Sunday, May 17, we build bridges over that moving creek and celebrate our youth who are graduating from high school, middle school, and elementary school. Our virtual worship service allows us to become a shelter in place, a holding space for all those students we love and celebrate. The end of May ushers in our annual meeting as leaders rotate off various committees and the Board while the creek brings us new leaders beginning their terms. We take on the task of thanking volunteers for their years of service while blessing volunteers to our good work.

Despite our sign on the door, “closed until further notice,” the UUCC remains a vibrant community that flows through the heart of our city, nurturing life and hope. Our chalice blazes brightly as a beacon for justice, open mindedness, and love. Despite our social distance, we remain connected to each other and our values that bind us together in the covenant of community.

The doors will open again one day. We will come out of hiding and create a new normal to our daily lives. The UUCC will be as strong as ever. We have to be. There are too many people looking for a safe place to search for truth and meaning. There are too many guns in the hands of predators hunting African American men for sport as they jog. There are too many hungry stomachs, hearts, and minds in need of nourishment. There are too many labels of exclusion and oppression, too many abuses of power, too many pollutants choking our earth. The energy that flows from 2701 Heyward Street transforms our culture around us every day. We are the UUCC!

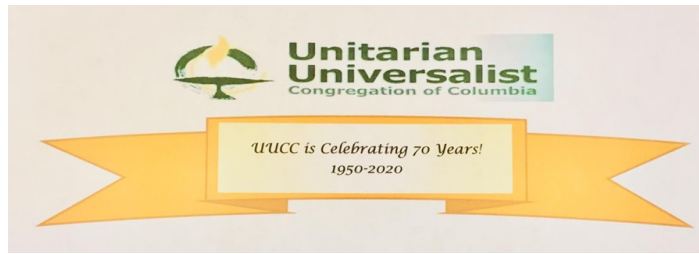

Yes to Life - In Spite of Everything - A Rediscovered, Previously Untranslated Masterpiece by the Author of the International Bestseller *Man's Search for Meaning*. Eleven months after he was liberated from the Nazi concentration camps, Viktor E. Frankl held a series of public lectures in Vienna. The psychologist, who would soon become world famous, explained his central thoughts on meaning, resilience, and the importance of embracing life even in the face of great adversity. He then edited those talks into a book. Published here for the very first time in English, Frankl's words resonate as strongly today as they did in 1946. He offers an insightful exploration of the maxim "Live as if you were living for the second time," and he unfolds his basic conviction that every crisis contains opportunity. Despite the unspeakable horrors of the camps, Frankl learned from the strength of his fellow inmates that it is always possible to "say yes to life" - a profound and timeless lesson for us all. <https://www.uuabookstore.org/Yes-to-Life-P18653.aspx>
