

What You Can Do to Stop Racism Laura Hartwig, Social Action Chair

Here is a short list of things you can do from home.

- **1.** Make an #endwhitesilence sign and head to an action, plan your own or post a photo of you with it online.
- **2.** <u>Volunteer with UU the Vote!</u> There is a role for everyone in this work. Volunteers are critical to building a massive coordinated campaign. Join the team of UUs fighting for justice and democracy.
- **3.** <u>Unfinished Business: A Study of DuBois' Reconstruction in</u> America to Now

Four Wednesdays: June 10, June 17, July 1 and July 8. This political education series offered by Side With Love and Love Resists will explore the history of the reconstruction era (post-civil war), to give us a deeper understanding of the origin of today's systemic racism in policing and mass incarceration as well as the Black-led movements resisting it. In this pivotal protest movement sparked by the law-enforcement-linked murders of George Floyd, Amaud Ahmery, Breonna Taylor, and Tony McDade - only the most recent Black lives to be lost to police violence - we'll learn from the past to be ready for today, and to build towards the world we dream of.

- **5.** The local Simple Justice Black Lives Matter group suggests that we donate to the Party for Socialism and Liberation (PSL) at Soda City Bail (Run by Julie Edwards) through Cashapp or Venmo. PSL is doing a lot of organizing around these protests. They plan to focus on arrests made in connection with the protest, which are mostly curfew violations. 6. Other wavs from Planned Parenthood to join the movement and support Black communities:

- Take action with Color of Change here or text FLOYD to 55156.
- Call your U.S. Senators to urge them to pass additional federal relief using this <u>click-to-call tool</u>.
- Contact your representative and urge him to support Reps. Ayanna Pressley, Ilhan Omar, Barbara Lee, and Karen Bass's <u>resolution</u> to condemn police brutality, racial profiling, and use of excessive force.
- Donate to <u>Black Voters Matter</u> to support the voter registration efforts of Black voters.
- Educate yourself and the people around you by reading these anti-racism resources.

7. Suggestions for how to take action from the UUA:

- We recommend joining and supporting the <u>Movement for Black Lives</u> and following their lead. Please donate to their organization, if you can.
- <u>Click here</u> for a list of actions from Courage Campaign to support BIPOC communities.
- **Demand that your local city or town enact these eight reforms.** Campaign ZERO, a data-informed platform to end police violence, has identified eight policies that can decrease police violence by 72%. Learn more about these policies on their #8CantWait website and demand that your city or town implement them.
- Read and support these <u>recommendations for Congressional action</u> from Ben and Jerry's.
- **Donate to support bail funds** for protesters of police violence.
- **Donate to organizations** fighting racism and police brutality.
- Take action with Color of Change.

Sharing Our Abundance, June Share the Plate Recipient Free Medical Clinic

Half of our Share the Plate collection this month goes to the Free Medical Clinic, which provides quality healthcare, at no cost, to residents of the community who cannot pay for such services and who have no health insurance. This clinic is their only option to have access to health care. The staff and volunteers operate six examination rooms, a pharmacy, a small laboratory, a classroom for patient education and meetings, a waiting room, and offices. Community partnerships are key to the Clinic's success in providing comprehensive medical services and the continuous evolution of their programs. These partnerships also allow them to connect their patients with services currently beyond the Clinic's scope.
