

Message From Our Minister

The Hebrew Scriptures records the story of Joseph, in the book of Genesis. In summary, Joseph was sold into slavery by his brothers in a fit of jealous rage. They had originally planned to kill him and opted for selling him into slavery instead, at the intervention of one of his brothers. From there, we follow Joseph’s life as he moves from place to place, not as a free man, but as one whose fate is determined by the different people who believe they own him. He ends up in the house of Pharaoh and shares an interpretation of a dream of Pharaoh’s that ends up helping Egypt survive a severe famine and economic crisis. The famine is so severe that Joseph’s brothers travel to Egypt in search of help, only to find themselves face to face, begging for help, from this brother they had abused and betrayed.

There’s a line in that story that Joseph speaks, which does not excuse their behavior, overlook the pain of the tragic events of his life, or gloss over the evil act of being sold as a slave. However, it does show the potential for a transformative experience of a horrific situation. Joseph says, “what you intended for evil, your intent to harm me, has now been transformed into good, and will contribute to the well being of all.” (This is my interpretation and paraphrasing)

The United States will forever have the stain of the evil of slavery in our history. This is something we can never forget or believe that it has been resolved. We built our economy on the horrific kidnapping, and buying and selling of fellow human beings, in the misguided and corrupt thinking of “owning” persons. This practice created a toxic way of seeing persons of color as inferior, and the events of the past year have been a clear reminder of this corrupt fire that still smolders in our culture.

February is African American History month. This month gives us an opportunity to recognize and celebrate the statement of Joseph lived out in the lives of so many, “what you intended for evil has been transformed into something good, and will contribute to the well being of all.” This month points us to the resiliency of African Americans in our country to overcome, create, invent, intervene, and lead to make this nation as great as we can be. May we all take time each day in February, to honor and remember.

Scheduling UUCC Zoom Meetings Delivered via UUCC Zoom Account

While the pandemic is preventing us from being physically together, we can still come together to enhance connections and further our spiritual growth, as well as conduct the business of our congregation.

The UUCC has obtained two Zoom licenses for congregational use. The following are the steps to schedule a UUCC Zoom meeting using these:

Check the UUCC calendar at <http://www.uucolumbia.dreamhosters.com/news/calendar/> to determine availability for a date/time. NOTE: Two meetings can be held simultaneously (Z1 and Z2). You can schedule a recurring meeting, e.g., every Thursday 4-5 p.m., but make sure all these slots are available throughout the time period.

Contact Andrea Dudick by email at uucc@uucolumbia.org to confirm date/time slot availability.

You will be contacted via email by a UUCC Zoom Host with access information. The host will work with you to determine the assistance you might require in hosting your Zoom meeting.

The host will start the meeting and stay on as needed or leave the meeting making you or a designee the host.

NOTE: Use of the Zoom accounts follows the established policy on building usage, i.e., the use must originate from a UUCC committee or be approved by the Board and the event must be placed on the official UUCC calendar by our Administrator, Andrea Dudick (uucc@uucolumbia.org).

Please Donate to the Transitions Winter Shelter

The Social Action Committee is again soliciting donations of lightly used clothing (especially hats, gloves and coats), current magazines and unused personal-sized toiletries for the [**Inclement Weather Center**](#), known as the “winter shelter” for the city’s adult homeless. The city funded shelter, managed by Transitions, is open from November 1 to April 1 when the temperature falls below 40F. So far this season it has already been open several times, serving about 50 client per night and that number will grow to over 100 as winter arrives. Transitions is doing its best to protect clients, staff and volunteers from COVID19 and does not want to halt serving this population in need.

General Assembly is the annual gathering of Unitarian Universalists, where we conduct business of the Association, explore the theological underpinnings of our faith, and lean fully into our mission and principles. That remains true even when we cannot gather physically. Last year, over 4,900 registered attendees participated from around the world. Although we give up the face-to-face interaction and hugs that are prevalent when we meet in-person, we retain our dedication to community and make our experience more accessible and more environmentally sustainable. Those of us who have attended GA's in person over the years know that they are an exhilarating and fun experience. Virtual can be too, with the added benefit of being able to drink coffee, eat snacks, and take quick breaks without walking 500 yards down the convention hallway!

Registration opened December 1st. To register, go to <https://www.uua.org/ga/registration>. Virtual GA 2021 is \$200 per person. Financial aid as well as a payment plan are available. GA registrants will receive access to the 2021 Online Participation Portal, including live, simulive (look this new word up!), and on-demand video content, the virtual exhibit hall, chat features, support, and a (new!) GA mobile app.
