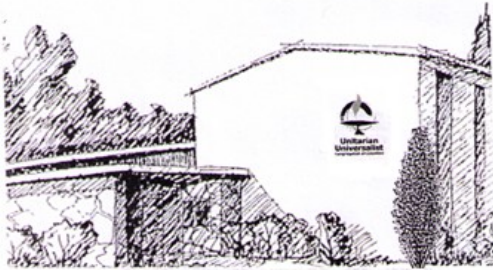

Message From Our Minister

We have neared the end of another school year, a year that has faced the challenges of conducting education in the midst of a global pandemic. We will be celebrating the accomplishments and milestones of members of our RE program, as we dedicate the last Sunday in May to our Bridging Ceremony in the worship service. Family and friends of beloved UUCC member, Marilyn Miss, who passed peacefully at 6:19 the evening of April 26. All four of her children were there, and afterwards they celebrated her life with an Indian meal at sunset on the banks of the Saluda River. More information, including about a memorial service, will be forthcoming.

Marilyn Miss was born in St. Paul, Minnesota, on August 1, 1927, and died in Columbia, SC, on April 26, 2021. Her family moved to Hawaii for a year and then to Manchester, Iowa, where she started school. She later lived in Bemidji and Minneapolis, MN, before moving to California during high school. Marilyn received a Masters Degree in Elementary Education from California State University, Los Angeles.

She taught elementary school in California and Ohio. Later she taught early childhood special education in California and Colorado.

She is survived by son Michael Masters of Columbia, SC; son Martin Masters and daughter-in-law Debra Lynn Masters of Shoreview, MN; daughter Susan Steedman and son-in-law John Steedman of Columbia, SC; and son Matthew Masters of Buford, GA; as well as her sister Patrician Alzobaie of Morelia, Mexico. She had six grandchildren: Victor Rivera, Christopher Masters, Morgan Masters, Sarah Steedman, Michael Masters and Jonathan Masters.

Marilyn had a lifelong interest in religion and politics. She enjoyed reading, cooking, hiking, swimming and attending art exhibits, lectures and political rallies. Marilyn lived in a number of states and enjoyed learning about different communities. She loved nature and being outdoors, especially in her beloved Rocky Mountains.

Are you a little lost in the alphabet soup? Do you have questions about the queer community? Has someone in your life come out, and you want to support them, but you don't know where to start or how to avoid offense? Star is hosting a three-part series running on the last three Fridays of May. Each session will build on the next. Children may attend *with adults*, as we will discuss bodies and functions in medical terms, but not intimate acts. If you miss a session, they will be recorded, and you can watch them in order to catch up for the next. May 21: *The Construct of Gender*

Scheduling UUCU Zoom Meetings Delivered via UUCU Zoom Account

While the pandemic is preventing us from being physically together, we can still come together to enhance connections and further our spiritual growth, as well as conduct the business of our congregation.

The UUCU has obtained two Zoom licenses for congregational use. The following are the steps to schedule a UUCU Zoom meeting using these:

Check the UUCU calendar at <http://www.uucolumbia.dreamhosters.com/news/calendar/> to determine availability for a date/time. NOTE: Two meetings can be held simultaneously (Z1 and Z2). You can schedule a recurring meeting, e.g., every Thursday 4-5 p.m., but make sure all these slots are available throughout the time period.

Contact Andrea Dudick by email at uucc@uucolumbia.org to confirm date/time slot availability.

You will be contacted via email by a UUCU Zoom Host with access information. The host will work with you to determine the assistance you might require in hosting your Zoom meeting.

The host will start the meeting and stay on as needed or leave the meeting making you or a designee the host.

NOTE: Use of the Zoom accounts follows the established policy on building usage, i.e., the use must originate from a UUCU committee or be approved by the Board and the event must be placed on the official UUCU calendar by our Administrator, Andrea Dudick (uucc@uucolumbia.org).
