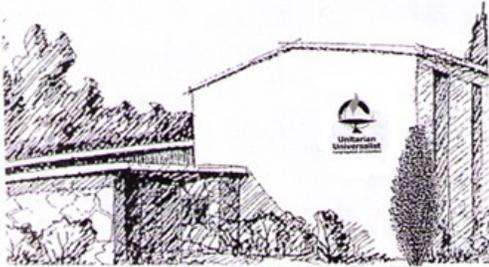

The UUCU has obtained two Zoom licenses for congregational use. The following are the steps to schedule a UUCU Zoom meeting using these:

Check the UUCU calendar at <http://www.uucolumbia.dreamhosters.com/news/calendar/> to determine availability for a date/time. NOTE: Two meetings can be held simultaneously (Z1 and Z2). You can schedule a recurring meeting, e.g., every Thursday 4-5 p.m., but make sure all these slots are available throughout the time period.

You will be contacted via email by a UUCU Zoom Host with access information. The host will work with you to determine the assistance you might require in hosting your Zoom meeting.

The host will start the meeting and stay on as needed or leave the meeting making you or a designee the host.

*NOTE: Use of the Zoom accounts follows the established policy on building usage, i.e., the use must originate from a UUCU committee or be approved by the Board and the event must be placed on the official UUCU calendar by our Administrator, Andrea Dudick ([uucc@uucolumbia.org](mailto:uucc@uucolumbia.org)).*

# Denominational Connections

## UUA General Assembly June 23 – 27, 2021

To repeat, the 2021 UUA General Assembly will be virtual again this year. Four UUCC members volunteered and were approved by the Board to serve as UUCC delegates. They are Linda Brennison, Karen Brown, Carolyn West and Keitha Whitaker. If you would like to register as an attendee, go to <https://www.uua.org/ga/registration>. The cost is \$200 per person, but there is financial aid, as well as a payment plan, available. As a registrant you will receive access to the 2021 Online Participation Portal, including live and on-demand video content, the virtual exhibit hall, chat features, support, and a new GA Mobile App.

## What's all this about an 8<sup>th</sup> UU Principle?

Article II of the UUA Bylaws, **Principles and Purposes**, is the foundation for all of the work of our UUA and its member congregations. It is the covenant to which all of our congregations pledge themselves when they become members of our UUA. Our UU Principles are set forth in Article II.

Our current Principles and Purposes were last revised in **1987**. At GA in New Orleans in 2017, there was discussion of amending the current 7 Principles to add an 8th Principle, specifically addressing racism, and of amending the 1st Principle, addressing non-human life. The 5th Principle was also the subject of a report in 2009, which dealt with the ways in which GA and other UU gatherings do and don't embody an inclusive democratic process. The 7th Principle has also been the subject of discussions about possible amendments.

There have been many other projects, resolutions, task forces and other strategies that have come from the UUA Board, the UU Commission on Appraisal and grassroots groups which encourage a comprehensive review of all our UU principles, purposes, bylaws and rules, to bring them up to date after a generation of societal change.

In response to all these discussions, the UUA Board established the Article II Study Commission to consider possible amendments to this Article. The Charge to the Commission included engaging the active participation of UUs across all demographics, identities, and theological/philosophical beliefs. The Commission is to be communicating progress frequently with UUs through as many channels and communication media as possible.

The Commission is charged with reviewing all sections of Article II, and is free to revise, replace, or restructure them as needed to meet the objectives stated above. There is nothing sacred about the number of principles or sources, nor their specific wordings, nor in the way that Article II is laid out. Creativity is encouraged. The Board wants to see a new proposed Article II that is inspirational, memorable and poetic. The language should be inclusive and welcoming, and explicitly anti-racist.

The work of the Commission is scheduled for presentation to the Board in early 2022, with a goal of presenting the revised Article II at the June 2022 General Assembly in Portland, OR.

The **unedited** proposed 8<sup>th</sup> Principle:

***We, the member congregations of the Unitarian Universalist Association, covenant to affirm and promote: journeying toward spiritual wholeness by working to build a diverse multicultural Beloved Community by our actions that accountably dismantle racism and other oppressions in ourselves and our institutions.***

Rather than wait for the slow process of change at the UUA level, some UU congregations around the country have or are engaged in lively conversations about the proposed 8<sup>th</sup> Principle of Unitarian Universalism, and some 40 to 50 congregations have already voted to adopt the 8<sup>th</sup> Principle in their own Congregational By-Laws.
