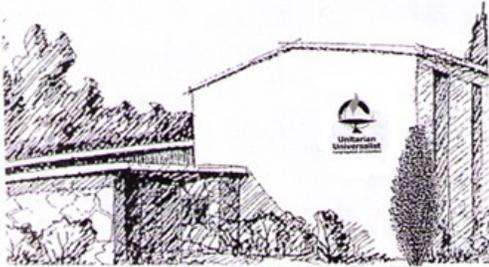

Message From Our President-Elect: Deb Matherly

Pat Mohr noted in the President’s message at our annual meeting that our congregation faces three major challenges in the coming year: To rebuild and revitalize our membership, to rebuild and revitalize our Children and Youth Religious Exploration (CYRE), and to establish a sustainable financial footing. I see these three as so interrelated and interdependent that I’d like to combine membership and finance as one “leg of the stool”, CYRE, Adult Youth, and Adult RE as another “leg”, and add restoring and reimagining our connections and relation to the broader UUA as a third “leg of the stool” (recognizing that all we do, including all our committees from Caring, Building and Grounds, Kitchen, Finance, Social Action, Green Team, Personnel, Worship, and more, are all crucial to our sustainment and growth, but focusing on three areas is easier than ten or twelve!)

I believe these three main challenges and opportunities are strongly interconnected, and that each can help us grow to be a stronger, wiser, more compassionate, and inclusive congregation and community. For today’s message I’d like to focus on the most imminent opportunity and challenge: the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) General Assembly (GA).

Over 1,000 congregations are sending their delegates and members to UUA, in person and virtually. This is a golden opportunity to interact with other UUs, to learn and share ideas. I encourage all members and friends to engage in at least one or two sessions, more if you have time. Please be mindful of what Rebecca Drennan shared with us about listening to learn.

From the UUCC Treasurer

June 12, 2022

As we approach the end of the UUCC 2021-2022 fiscal year, it is time to give an overview of some of the highlights of this year.

First—and perhaps most important—was the hiring of Michele Currie as our new bookkeeper. Michele has a broad background in accounting functions and was a perfect match for our needs as we work our way toward providing more comprehensive and informative financial statements. Many changes have already been accomplished and several more are expected during the upcoming year. In addition, the bookkeeping functions which have been performed by the UUCC administrator for many years have now been assigned to Michele, providing for a much smoother work flow while maintaining necessary checks and balances.

While most aspects of revenue and expense have been greatly impacted by the pandemic of the past two years, our community has done a very good job of providing the funds needed to keep our cash flow in balance. In addition, the Board of Trustees voted to pay down the mortgage on our property so that it will be paid off in July 2023, approximately five years ahead of schedule. They also voted to secure a line of credit as a balance against this use of ready cash. This line of credit has not been used and we see no need to access it in the foreseeable future, but it provides insurance against major unexpected needs.

Other major changes to our balance sheet include the capitalization of major equipment purchases and building improvements. This includes major repair and replacement of soffits plus the building of a wall to provide office space for the bookkeeper. We will be “catching up” on that aspect of our accounting in the upcoming year which will provide a more realistic view of the value of our property. Future statements will also detail changes in the balance of the UUCC endowment account.

This year’s statement of revenue and expense is expected to be close to being balanced by the end of June. Most line items of expense stayed well within the proposed budget with the bookkeeper’s compensation being the only major overage. That overage was expected after the decision was made to add to her duties.

Finally, I would like to remind you that each month our financial statements are posted on the bulletin board at the entrance to the social hall. I encourage you to look at them. I would be happy to discuss them at any time. Michele is also available to answer questions.

Thank you for allowing me to serve this very special congregation.

UUCC COVID 19 Health Protocols

Effective May 1, 2022

Safety Precautions- Vaccinations, Masks, and Social Distancing. Masking inside the sanctuary and the building are OPTIONAL, with the following provisions:

- a. If the transmission risk in the community increases and the guidance from the public health experts change, we may require that masks be worn indoors at all times again.
- b. Any singing will require that masks be worn.
- c. We recommend that people with specific high-risk conditions or who are not vaccinated (i.e., children ages 2-5) should continue to wear a mask for the safety of themselves and those around them.
- a. UUCC recommends that everybody who is eligible gets the COVID 19 vaccine and booster/s.

Additional safety considerations. Any person who is ill or who has tested positive for COVID should not attend any in-person gathering until a physician has cleared them as no longer in danger of infecting others. Anyone who attends an event in the UUCC buildings or grounds and is later diagnosed as having COVID should notify the UUCC Administrator (uucc@uucolumbia.org.) Names of infectious persons will not be a part of public notifications.

Social Action Committee members met on Monday, May 23, at Connie Quirk & Kevin McKinney's house on Lake Wateree to reinvigorate and reorganize for what we hope will be a (mostly) Covid-free in-person reality. Discussion focused on what it would mean for UUCC to adopt the invitation by SCUUJA—the *South Carolina UU Justice Alliance*—to be in covenant with them and with other UU congregations and fellowships in our state, and on assessing our congregation's ability to be a responsible partner for SCUUJA. Green Sanctuary 2030: Heat Mapping

Heat Kills!

While surfing the Internet today I came across a post with one of those fake signs. This one said: ATTN: New residents. SC is still preheating. It's hot, and it's getting hotter. What does this mean for us and other residents of South Carolina? Heat stresses our bodies and our infrastructure. Heat creates health risks, which are not distributed equally across the population. If we are lucky enough to have air conditioning, we'll pay more for it and use more electricity while doing so. We can expect our heat issues to get worse with ongoing climate change.

The New Southern Hotspot

Columbia's current tourist slogan is The New Southern Hotspot. Columbia is Famously Hot. This slogan works in so many ways. We are quite literally the South Carolina hotspot. The upstate has altitude to moderate its temperatures. The coast has the Atlantic Ocean. We have neither.

We Need Data

We have long term weather records for selected locations, such as the airports. We know, in general, how hot Columbia is and what the long-term trends are. But we do not have detailed information about the patterns of heat islands within the midlands. What neighborhoods are most at risk? What populations are most likely to suffer from extended heat spells? How can specific actions, such as planting trees, moderate the impacts of heat? We now have a chance to help gather this data.

Urban Heat Mapping Initiative

The City of Columbia and Richland County have been selected to participate in a national and international urban heat island mapping initiative aimed at better understanding and guiding action to reduce heat health risks, encourage economic development, and improve overall quality of life in the region. Volunteers are needed to drive defined routes in the Columbia area on Saturday, August 6, using sensors to gather heat island data. We hope that some UUCC members and friends can help with this effort. "When I came out as gay more than 10 years ago, there were only four letters commonly used to group various sexual and gender minorities: L, G, B and T... Times and attitudes have changed, and the language used to discuss sexual orientation and gender identity has also changed. As a result, the established [L.G.B.T.](#) abbreviation has acquired a few extra letters — ... Take, for example, the addition of “Q” that became increasingly popular as the 20th century turned into the 21st. Some insisted this stood for “questioning,” representing people who were uncertain of their sexual orientations or gender identities. Others declared it was for “queer,” a catchall term that has shed its derogatory origins and is gaining acceptance... Now there’s also I, for intersex; A, for ally (or asexual, depending on whom you’re talking to); and often a plus sign meant to cover anyone else who’s not included: L.G.B.T.Q.I.A.+...” By [Michael Gold](#) June 21, 2018, Updated on June 7, 2019

The Seven Principles of Unitarian Universalism

Grateful for the religious pluralism that enriches and ennobles our faith, we are inspired to deepen our understanding and expand our vision. We covenant to affirm and promote:

1. The inherent worth and dignity of every person
2. Justice, equity, and compassion in human relationships
3. Acceptance of one another and encouragement of spiritual growth in our congregations
4. A free and responsible search for truth and meaning
5. The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and society at large
